The Science of Emotional Intelligence – The Missing Ingredient Behind Building a Highly Engaged Organizational Culture

Why would anyone want to be led by you? This is the single most important question a manager or leader needs to ask themselves if they want to unlock the potential and creativity of their people. Bill's experience in technology and sales gives him real-world experience in the types of challenges that organizations face today. Bill loves to write and contributed to the New York Times and Amazon bestselling book, Performing Under Pressure: The Science of Doing Your Best When it Matters Most, co-authored by IHHP's JP Pawliw-Fry and published in 65 countries with multiple translations. Bill is also a regular contributor to CEO magazine, Training Magazine, as well as other leadership publications.

Bill is originally from Canada and moved to New York City in the nineties. He now calls Chicago home and it is here you will find him indulging in his other passions - his family, scotch, and cycling.







BREAKFAST AND KEYNOTE — COACH DAN MCCARNEY Saturday, June 22, 8:00 a.m. – 9:30 a.m.

Join us for breakfast and a keynote presentation from Coach Dan McCarney. Born and raised in lowa City, McCarney made his mark on the gridiron as both a player and a coach for the lowa Hawkeyes and a hall of fame head coach for the lowa State Cyclones. Whether you're a Cyclone or a Hawkeye, chances are you've cheered for McCarney at one point or another. McCarney will share his experiences, the highs and lows of college athletics and the lessons that can be applied to your everyday life. Fun fact: McCarney coached MCAI President, Jeff Koeppel, at lowa from 1986–1989.

Patrick Daniel "Dan" McCarney was born and raised in lowa City. After starring at lowa City High he went on to become an offensive lineman at the University of lowa from 1972 to 1974 and was named team captain in 1974. He returned to lowa as a graduate assistant from 1977 to 1978 under Bob Commings. When Hayden Fry arrived at lowa in 1979, he named McCarney as defensive line coach, a post he held for 11 years--during which lowa made two appearances in the Rose Bowl. He served as the defensive coordinator and defensive line coach at the University of Wisconsin under Barry Alvarez from 1990 to 1994.

He served as head coach at lowa State University from 1995 to 2006. During that span, McCarney led the Cyclones to five bowl games, more than any other lowa State coach in school history. The Cyclones had been to only three bowl games in their entire history before his arrival. In their first bowl appearance under McCarney, the 2000 Insight.com Bowl, the Cyclones notched their first bowl win in school history. McCarney finished his Cyclone career as the longest-tenured (1995-2006) and winningest (56) coach in lowa State football history.

In February 2007, McCarney accepted a position as the defensive line coach and assistant head coach at the University of South Florida. The next year, he accepted the same position at the University of Florida. He coached the defensive line at Florida for three years. During his tenure, the Gators produced NFL draft picks Carlos Dunlap and Jermaine Cunningham. He was 30-2 in 32 games at Florida, winning a National Championship in 2008. From 2011 to 2015, McCarney served as head coach at the University of North Texas, where he went 22-32 and won the Heart of Dallas Bowl in 2014.

In September 2016, McCarney was inducted into the lowa State Athletics Hall of Fame.

Additional coaching highlights:

- · Coached in 20 bowl games including 3 Rose Bowls, Orange Bowl and Sugar Bowl
- Coached in 25 lowa/lowa State football games
- Inducted into Iowa City City High Hall of Fame in 2005
- Went from the Bottom 10 in America to Bowl Champs at Iowa, Wisconsin, Iowa State and North Texas
- Went from 1-10 to 10-1 at Wisconsin and won the first Rose Bowl in school history in 1994
